THE 16TH AMP – ON TRACK IN 2020!

THE AUSTRALIAN MUSIC PRIZE (THE AMP) ANNOUNCES THAT ITS 16TH PRIZE, FOR ELIGIBLE 2020 ALBUM RELEASES, IS ON COURSE TO DELIVER A SHORTLIST AND WINNER EARLY IN 2021.

THE JUDGES of The AMP have been listening to over 300 albums since June and have – so far – Nominated 52 albums as contenders – the best albums of 2020 – the list follows.

NOMINATED ALBUMS include releases by: #1 Dads, DMA'S, (previous winners) Eddy Current Suppression Ring, Rolling Blackouts Coastal Fever, RVG, Tame Impala, The Chats, The Necks, Violent Soho and 5 Seconds Of Summer.

Q&A WITH SCOTT MURPHY FOUNDER/PRIZE DIRECTOR OF THE AUSTRALIAN MUSIC PRIZE

When you realised that you couldn't raise prize money, why didn't you just give The AMP a year off?

"Because that wouldn't be fair to the hundreds of Australian artists who are releasing albums in 2020. I surveyed many people, especially artists and they all said prize money, or not, the prize should go ahead."

Are the artists who have Nominated albums being told there's no prize money?

"Absolutely. I don't, as yet, have contact details for many of them but everyone I have made contact with has been advised that at this point I can not commit to offer prize money. Most come back simply saying 'no worries, just happy my album has been Nominated."

Rather than the online store, did you consider a crowd funding campaign?

"Yes, I spent quite a bit of time researching this and it was a very valid option at one point. However, I decided that to make it successful I would have to ask for a lot from artists – previous winners and those Nominated in 2020 – so as to have 'rewards' to offer and from the beginning my policy has been that just because our judges say you've made a great album, doesn't mean you have to give back. And let's face it, 2020 has been hard enough on them."

Do you think you will sell enough t-shirts to be able to offer a significant cash prize to the winner?

"Yes. I was a little uncertain until I saw the great design! The design coupled with the very simple message – if you love Aussie made music then help the bands by buying a t-shirt – should work. The key is to get the message spread very wide and I've many industry friends helping with that."

Is the t-shirt campaign a short term effort?

"No, I am planning on it staying there and we will add new versions every March, when there's a new winner and again at this time of the year, launching the next prize."

What happens next with the 16th AMP?

"There will be another major announcement in December, it will contain the complete/final list of 2020 Nominated albums – the albums our judges liked. Last year this list was 107 albums long out of 440 eligible albums – the numbers are looking similar this year. As per previous prizes, the Shortlist will be determined in January, announced end Jan/early Feb and then a select panel of the judges will meet in March to decide on and announce, a winner."

In the past you've hosted an industry lunch where all Shortlisted artists are celebrated and then the winner is announced, is this the plan?

"That's not looking good at this point! First step is to have funding in place so that selected judges that don't reside in Melbourne, can be brought in for that final face-to-face meet. I think many industry workers would be happy to pay for their lunch if that goes ahead but I wouldn't ever want the Shortlisted artists to pay so we'll see how funding works out. Either way, we'll have a winner and the process of getting to that point remains the same."
